



New BSRG Financial Structure



The BSRG Awards Trust.

Aim: to safeguard long term healthy finances of the BSRG awards.

Benefits:

- Facilitation of fundraising, thereby giving the awards their own source of income.
- Clarification of the tax status of the BSRG award money.
- Gifts will be financially attractive to donors and the BSRG (they will be eligible for "gift aid").
- The remainder of the BSRG (its AGM and postgraduate activities) will be a *de facto* "small charitable association with broad membership" as defined by the Charity Commission, which due to its modest size does not need to register with the Charity Commission or Her Majesties Revenue and Customs. This clarifies the BSRG administrative structure.



FEATURED BSRG postgraduate fieldtrip 2017: Devon and North Cornwall

The 2017 BSRG postgraduate field trip was held in North Cornwall and Devon from the 20^{th} to the 22^{th} of October. The trip was led by Dr Matthew Walkinson from the University of Pymouth and EPI Geoscience and organized by Kévin Boulsateix from the University of Manchester. We were happy to be joined by 50 young researchers (PhD students, post-docs and young professionals from industry) from all over the UK and the world (including Malaysia).

After a short introduction about the geology of the area on Friday evening, we focused on the Late Pleistocene to Devonian age straia of the North Devon Basin at Saunton Sands on Sautody morning. It was a very good opportunity to look at the impressive angular unconformity between the Late Pleistocene and the uppermost Devonian (350 Myr are missing) as well as to compare modern beach processes with the non-deltaic shelf to supratidal silicitatic factes.







Objectives



→ Describe and evaluate the controls on sequence stratigraphy and sedimentary architecture in a range of clastic (fluvial, deltaic, shoreface, slope, deep-water), carbonate and mixed systems

➔ Evaluate the significance of these exposures to petroleum systems in the Lusitanian Basin and adjacent Atlantic Margin basins and as analogues for exploration and production






Code of conduct







